Senior Clinician/Lecturer in Veterinary Ophthalmology, Vetsuisse Faculty, University of Zurich

We invite applications for a full time senior clinician faculty position in Veterinary Ophthalmology.

The successful candidate will have the opportunity to work in a modern world-leading clinical setup. Participation in clinical service as well as teaching/research are expected. Patients include small animals, equine patients, cattle and exotic pets. Zoo animals are seen as requested in the zoos of Zurich and Basel. Translational clinical research is well established. The candidate will work alongside two boarded Veterinary Ophthalmologists, two ECVO Residents and one ophthalmology specialty Intern. Primary consultations and surgeries as well as supervision of Trainees, lecturing and providing training in ophthalmic examinations and basic surgeries to veterinary students are expected. Participation in the supervision of research projects of master students, interns and residents is desired.

Work/life conditions: The teaching hospital of the Vetsuisse Faculty Zurich is located within the city borders of Zurich. Zurich international airport as well as the city center can be reached by public transport within 15 minutes. Zurich offers outdoor experiences in the form of lakes, rivers and the foothills of the Alps but also a wide range of cultural and historical sites. The mountain range of the Alps is reachable within a 45-minute drive from Zurich and offers world class hiking, mountaineering and skiing. Travelling in and from Switzerland is easy due to an excellent infrastructure and the size of the country (a max 4h drive in all directions). The central location of Switzerland offers great opportunities to explore other countries and cultures within Europe.

Salary: The salary will be competitive and commensurate with the candidate's experience and qualifications according to university guidelines. Accident insurance as well as retirement plans are covered.

Qualifications: We are looking for a team player with enthusiasm and excellent communications skills. Candidates must have a DVM degree, recognized in Switzerland. They should be boarded or board eligible by the European or American College of Veterinary Ophthalmologists. Knowledge of the German language would be preferable. A high quality of clinical and teaching service is expected, the candidate must demonstrate outstanding clinical and interpersonal skills and ability to work with others in a collegial team environment.



Begin: Starting date is negotiable upon the availability of the successful applicant as of January 2018. Review of applicants begins immediately and continues until a suitable candidate is identified.
